Undergraduate Programs of Electives in Humanities and Social Sciences by Discipline/Degree	
<b>CEE, CS (BS)</b>	Student must take three (3) Humanities courses: two courses in the same discipline and one course in a different discipline. Student must take three (3) Social Science courses: two courses in the same discipline and one course in a different discipline.
<b>BME, ECE, MAE</b>	Student must take three (3) Humanities courses: PHIL 2135 (or NSC 4176) and two additional courses either in the same or different disciplines. Student must take three (3) Social Science courses: two courses in the same discipline and one course in a different discipline.
<b>EMSE</b>	Student must take two (2) Humanities courses: Both courses can be either in the same or different disciplines. Student must take two (2) Social Science courses: Both courses can be either in the same or different disciplines.
<b>CS (BA)</b>	Student must take four (4) Humanities courses: Courses can be either in the same or different disciplines. Student must take two (2) Social Science courses: Courses can be either in the same or different disciplines. See Advisor for CS (BA) form.

\* History may be counted as Social Science at Advisor's suggestion (only to satisfy SEAS requirement)
